GLEN ROCK OFFICALS PREPARE FOR FUTURE Make Provisions Now for Improvement of Rock Road and Elimination of Grade Crossings – Set New Street Lines in Center of Town

Looking to that point in the future when Glen Rock hopes to eliminate the two grade crossings in the center of town Borough Engineer Frank M. Evans is preparing an ordinance to further establish the width of the Erie Railroad and extending some 400 feet west.

The borough fathers are not anticipating any immediate movement for the construction of underpasses but believe that the initial step toward acquiring the land that will be necessary should be taken now when there are no buildings on the northerly side of Rock Road. Thus when the time does arrive when funds are available for the improvement the borough will not be put to the great expense of acquiring property on which buildings must be removed.

Progressive citizens of the community will be heartily in accord with the movement. It is a distinct display of vision which at some future time will mean a great saving to the community.

While Glen Rock is not expecting to proceed with the construction of underpasses to eliminate the dangerous railroad crossings nevertheless it is prepared. Plans and sketches have already been drawn and are ready when the time comes.
